It was originally a "one man show" with Santa as the only attraction. Santa travelled in a horse-drawn Eaton store delivery truck from Union Station through downtown Toronto handing out souvenirs and suprise packages along the route.

Santa "came to town" on a float, featuring a sleigh led by eight white mechanical reindeer. This has been Santa's trademark for the Parade ever since.

At a whopping 42 feet – the longest float that had ever been produced – joined the Parade to bring Santa to town in a grandiose fashion. It was used for six parades until it was replaced in 2022.
